

## City Wide Speed Survey Goes Into Effect

Every five years, the California Vehicle Code mandates that the City update its posted speed limits in order to legally continue using radar enforcement on City streets. The update involves a review of the existing speed limits, vehicle crashes, and field surveys of the prevailing speeds. The City-Wide Speed Survey went into effect on February 28, 2009. New speed limit signs and associated street markings are planned to be installed within one month and will be enforceable at that time. The following is a list of streets and the new speed limits:

- Grand Avenue—between Mountaineer Road & Amar Road will be 40 mph
- Lemon Avenue—between La Puente Road & Valley Blvd. will be 40 mph
- San Jose Hills Road—between Grand Avenue & Heidelberg Avenue will be 30 mph
- Temple Avenue—between Grand Avenue & Bonita Avenue will be 40 mph
- Camino De Teodoro—between Camino De Rosa & Calle Baja will be 35 mph
- Creekside Drive—between Amar Road & Lemon Avenue will be 35 mph
- Lemon Avenue—between Amar Road & La Puente Road will be 40 mph
- Mountaineer Road—between Grand Avenue & Sundowner Lane will be 35 mph
- Pierre Road—between Cardin Street & La Puente Road will be 35 mph
- Pierre Road—between Vejar Road & Valley Blvd. will be 35 mph
- Shadow Oak Drive—between Nogales Street & Colusa Drive will be 35 mph
